tent of their site while also fulfilling their obligations and responsibilities.

Democratic Representative Adam Schiff told ABC, "We need to find out what we can about the misappropriation of the privacy, the private information of tens of millions of American."

Facebook representatives have responded to the monumental leak. Initially the company remained calm about, almost downplaying, the issue, but has since addressed the issue with more concern. Paul Grewal, a vice president of the platform, has promised that the company will take action to protect its users. He also said that Cambridge Analytica has been suspended from the website, as well as top individuals from the firm. "We will take whatever steps are required to see that the data in question is deleted once and for all — and take action against all offending parties," said Grewal.

Cambridge Analytica is also involved in political controversy in the U.K. The firm is being investigated by both Parliament and government regulators for possible illegal activities during the "Brexit" campaign. The firm will likely be involved in a similar situation with the American political system. For now Cambridge Analytica denies claims that their actions violated any of Facebook's terms and conditions.

The revelation of a recent leak of personal information by social media giant Facebook caused the company's value to drop more than \$50 billion dollars this week. Numerous lawmakers have expressed worries regarding privacy

and social media after a breach in millions of user's information. Cambridge Analytica, a private company that gathers data for political campaigns and processes, collected private information on 50 million Facebook users without the individuals' permission or consent.

The right-leaning organization received a hefty donation from Republican donor Robert Mercer. The firm also promised Steve Bannon helpful tools that could identify voter personalities as well as influence voters. It is also believed that the information is still in Cambridge Analytica's possession.

This is not the first time Cambridge Analytica has been accused of collecting and sharing users' personal information. The firm has previously worked for political campaigns, most notably President Trump's 2016 presidential campaign. There were accusations of the firm leaking voter information during their work with the Trump campaign in 2016; however, this is the first time speculations have been confirmed. This is also not the first time Facebook has been used for an attempted political gain. In 2016 Russians allegedly used the platform to sway the American electoral process.

With this huge leak, people are starting to consider whether their information is actually safe on social media websites. Their are still many questions to be asked, but lawmakers have commented on the leak and

AUSTIN ON ALERT: PACKAGE BOMBER DELIVERS TERROR

Early Wednesday morning, the suspected Austin package bomber detonated an explosive device in his vehicle, killing himself, as authorities closed in on him.

Authorities identified the suspected bomber as Mark Anthony Conditt, a 24-year-old white male, just days after multiple bombings in the Austin area. Conditt fled from his hotel as police gathered, waiting on more firepower to arrive.

Austin Police Chief, Brian Manley, released a statement Wednesday morning, stating "We don't know where this suspect has spent his last 24 hours, and therefore we still need to remain vigilant to ensure that no other packages or devices have been left throughout the com-

Since the beginning of March, five package bombs "randomly" detonated, killing two and injuring multiple others.

The first attack occurred on March 2, when 39-year-old Stephen House was killed by a package bomb outside of his home.


The next two attacks both took place on March 12, in which an explosion killed 17-year-old Draylen Mason and his left his 41-year-old mother in critical condition. Later that day, a 75-year-old woman was seriously injured by an explosion outside her home.

An increasingly random attack happened on March 18, when a tripwire detonated a bomb on the side of the road, injuring two passersby.

The final bomb detonated March 20, at a FedEx facility in San Antonio, injuring one. A package shipped by the same individual was intercepted by authorities before delivery. It contained an explosive device.

Law enforcement believe all of these incidents are related, yet no clear connection has been established. Authorities are still searching for a motive behind these recent bombings, however nothing has been discovered at this point.

The tournament could go in any direction and upsets may still be to come, but there have been many exciting games and ruined brackets this year. The championship game will be held in the Alamodome in San Antonio on April 2.

Now, Americans are scared to attend university because they do not want to owe tens of thousands of dollars in student loan debt.

A solution for the average young American is to consider attending a trade school. A trade school, or a vocational school, is a school that offers career based programs. The purpose is to quickly prepare students for a job in the workforce.

The average trade school costs \$33,000 to get your degree, while the average four-year university costs \$127,000. I disagree with this simply because a trade school can offer a great job with respectable pay and even greater potential.

Another reason trade school might be a better option is the length of time it takes to get a degree. Trade schools typically take two years to graduate, compared to four at universities. 40 percent of four-year university students drop out before completing their degree. The shorter class time offered by trade schools might convince students to stay in school.

Trade schools offer programs for future electricians, air-conditioning technicians, and welders. Graduates from these programs can immediately find great jobs that pay a decent living. Another great aspect about these jobs is the demand will not decline anytime soon - there will always be a need for those in the trade industry.

Obtaining a bachelor's degree may pay out more in the long run, but some people are not looking for that. Some people simply want to insert themselves into the workforce and make a living immediately after high school. For a direct learner wanting to join the workforce directly out of college, trade school is a relatively cheap and safe option.


I absolutely encourage standing up for worthy causes, but when students wearing the "X"

do not fully understand the significance or actually support the cause, it changes my perspective of our generation and our brainwashed ideals.


We may act as though the we are individualistic and independent, but in reality, our every action is dictated by what is deemed "popular."

Creamy Shepherd's Pie:

March, while bringing the promise of spring, can be fickle weatherwise – glimpses of spring and summer greedily snatched away by the cold grip of winter. March also brings St. Patrick's Day – a celebration of Irish culture. This makes March the perfect time to make Shepards Pie. This traditional Irish recipe is comfort food at its finest. Creamy mashed potatoes on top of warm meat and veggies will surely make anyone's mouth water. This simple and easy recipe will have everyone coming for seconds so you might want to make extra!



Instructions

-Place the peeled and quartered potatoes in medium sized pot. Cover with at least an inch of cold water. Add a teaspoon of salt. Bring to a boil, reduce to a simmer, and cook until tender (about 20 minutes).

-While the potatoes are cooking, melt 4 tablespoons of the butter in a large sauté pan on medium heat. Add the chopped onions and cook until tender, about 6 to 10 minutes.

-Add ground beef to the pan with the onions and vegetables. Cook until no longer pink. Season with salt and pepper. Add the Worcestershire sauce and beef broth. Bring the broth to a simmer and reduce heat to low. Cook uncovered for 10 minutes, adding more beef broth if necessary to keep the meat from drying out.

- When the potatoes are done cooking (a fork can easily pierce), remove them from the pot and place them in a bowl with the remaining 4 Tbsp of butter. Mash with a fork or potato masher, and season with salt and pepper to taste.

- Preheat oven to 400°F. Spread the beef, onions, and vegetables in an even layer in a large baking dish (8 x 13 casserole).

- Spread the mashed potatoes over the top of the ground beef. Rough up the surface of the mashed

potatoes with a fork so there are peaks that will get well browned. You can even use a fork to make creative designs in the mashed potatoes.

- Place in a 400°F oven andcook until browned and bubbling, about 30 minutes. If necessary, broil for the last few minutes to help the surface of the mashed potatoes brown.

Ingredients

-1 1/2 to 2 pounds potatoes (about 3 large potatoes), peeled and quartered

-8 Tablespoons (1 stick) butter

-1 medium onion, chopped (about 1 1/2 cups)

-1-2 cups vegetables—diced carrots, corn, peas

-1 1/2 lbs ground round beef

-1/2 cup beef broth

-1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

-Salt, pepper, other seasonings of choice

In a study piloted by Zaheer Hussain, it was concluded that "Fortyone percent of people who play online video games admitted that they

As far as actual gameplay mechanics, many new changes were implemented this season. "Turbo building" mode and "Auto-Change Materials" allow players to build much faster, as the game automatically switches materials. The infamous "double pump" was patched following outlash from the community. "Double Pumping" allowed players to switch and shoot pump shotguns extremely fast, which forced Epic Games, the software company, to remove it from the game.

Season three also introduces two new weapons: the Hand Cannon and the Hunting Rifle. The Hand Cannon is a pistol that deals high damage, with a slow rate of fire. The Hand Cannon can be found in Epic and Legendary variants. The Hunting Rifle is a bolt-action rifle with no scope. The Hunting Rifle is a dulled down version of a Bolt-Action Sniper, offering less damage and less range.

Along with season three comes a brand new Battle Pass that is outer space themed – moving away from the season two's medieval theme. The Battle Pass costs 950 V-Bucks, the equivalent of \$10. The new Battle Pass has 100 unlockable tiers which includes six new player skins and 94 other cosmetics such as emotes, gliders and back bling. It takes 75–150 hours of playtime to unlock all 100 tiers, or \$150 worth of V-Bucks.


