VOTING DURING COVID-19

MAIL-IN VOTING

46% of voters casted their ballot by absentee or mail-in this year, with 32% of Trump supporters opting to vote by mail and 58% of Biden voters. With this year's surplus of mail in votes, it took some states weeks to diligently certify votes.



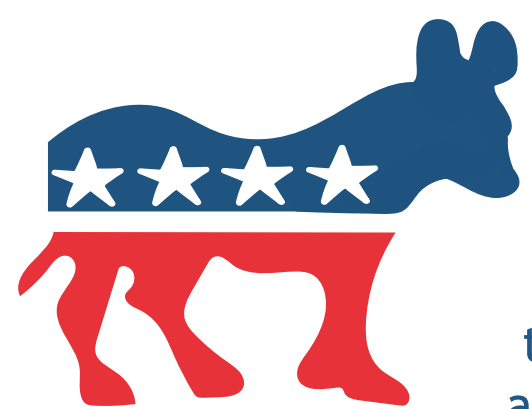

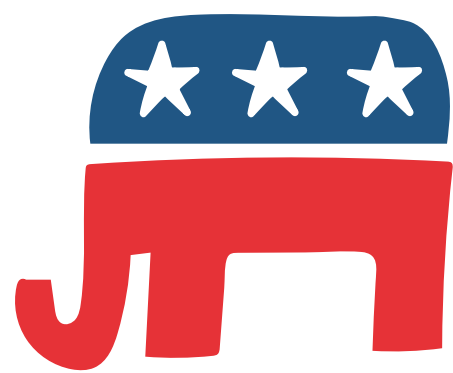

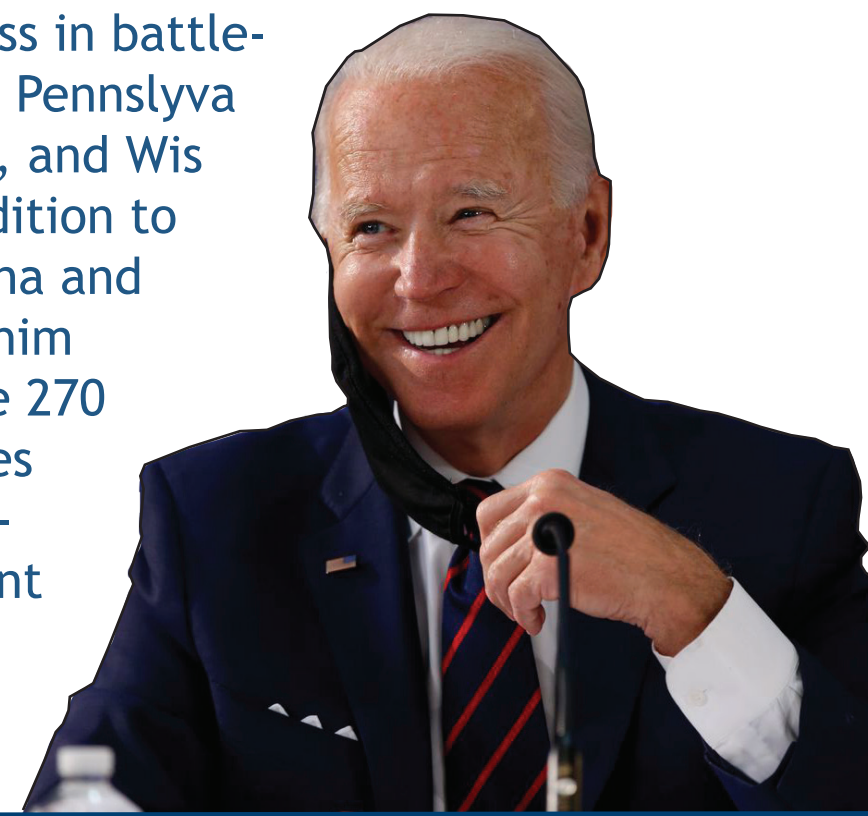

PRESIDENT-ELECT JOE BIDEN

Biden's success in battleground states Pennsylvania, Michigan, and Wisconsin, in addition to flipping Arizona and Georgia, led him to surpass the 270 electoral votes needed to become President of the United States.
