



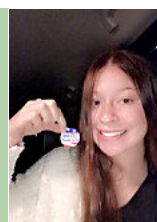
JACKELYN & CAROLYN FACIO (11)

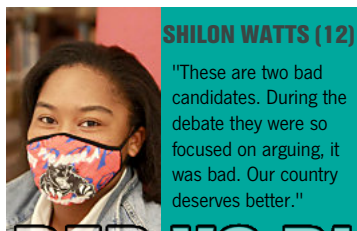
