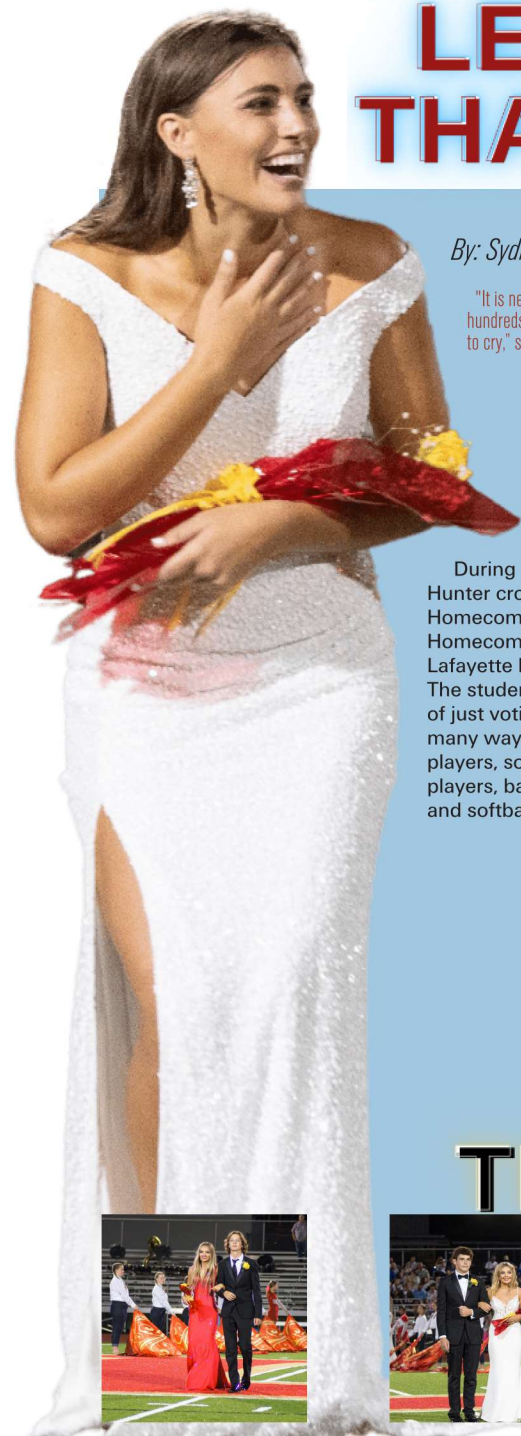


LET ME LIVE THAT FANTASY

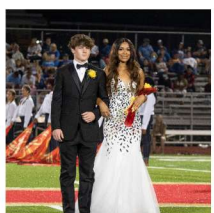

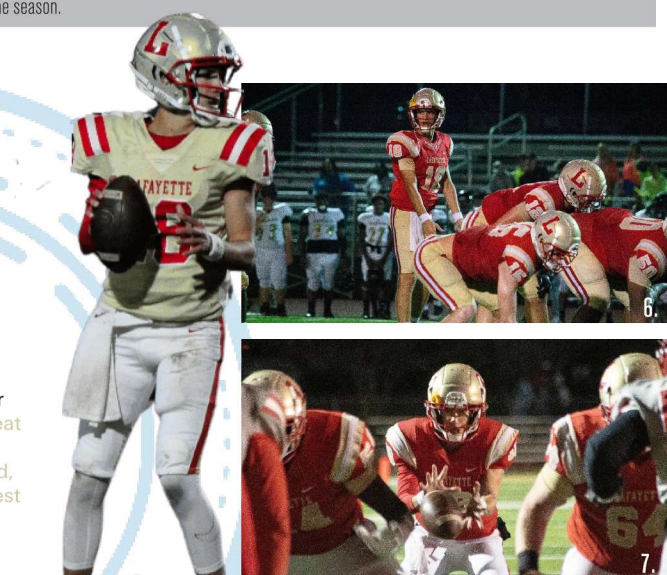


To make the night even better Jayden Reed, 11, runs the ball ending the game with a score of 47-10. This win led the Commodores to a 5-2 win for start of the season.
